Dear Parents and Guardians,

NAPLAN

Year 3 and Year 5 Naplan results were sent home with the children. We congratulate all the children on their effort and achievement and sincerely thank the teachers for their hard work and dedication in ensuring the children are well prepared. We know that the quality of the teacher makes the biggest impact on student learning. John Hattie's research indicates that teachers who have high expectations and collective teacher efficacy are the two biggest influence on student achievement. Therefore, we sincerely thank the teachers at Seabrook Primary School for their hard work, their constant striving to challenge students and their belief that all children can learn and improve. These qualities are making a real difference to the learning at Seabrook Primary School.

RESPECT

Results are in from our student attitudes to school. Students very strongly agreed that we demonstrate:

- High Expectations 96%
- Sense of inclusion 89%

One area of improvement is RESPECT:

- Respect for teachers 67% agree
- Respect for peers 57% agree

Respect is one of our core beliefs. It is a PYP attitude. We strive to encourage everyone to respect themselves, others and the world around them. It is important that as adults we model respect. We can show respect by parking carefully around the school (not parking in disabled zones, over driveways or in the drop off, pick up zone). We demonstrate respect in the way we speak to others, especially in times of conflict. Please think about the example you set your children in the respectful ways you treat yourself, your children, teachers and school members and the ways you respect our environment. All of us need to set a good example to our children and when we see our children showing respect acknowledge and praise them.

Our commitment to the Primary Years Program and inquiry learning means we are always striving to promote challenging, significant, engaging and relevant learning to our students.

**ITALIAN**

Our Italian teachers are involved in a wonderful program called CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning). Visitors from Melbourne University are coming to Seabrook Primary School to observe and discuss this program. Congratulations to our Italian teachers for their excellent work in teaching Italian.

PREP TRANSITION

Many preschool children have been attending Seabrook to visit classrooms and be involved in Book Week activities. We thank Mr Moodley, Mrs Rima and the Prep team for their work in helping our new students become familiar with school.

The **PREP** team are also busy planning for the Prep extended stay. This is part of our camping program. Preps have a late stay at school, Year 1 have dinner at school, Year 2 have a sleepover then Year 3 go to Phillip Island, Year 4 to the Grampians, Year 5 to Sovereign Hill and Year 6 a week long trip to Canberra.

YEAR 1 have arranged a guest speaker on the water cycle. We thank parents for their commitment and involvement in sharing their knowledge and expertise with the students.

YEAR 2 have been very engaged in their latest inquiry and will share some of their creative ideas at their Inventions Exhibition on Wednesday August 30. This is always a fascinating experience and I urge parents to make the time to listen to the children share their inventions.

Italian News Grade 3





As always, some excellent learning is taking place in ITALIAN so far this term...


part in our Immigration booklets. We even went into a room where we explored 5 immigration stories all linked to Australia in different times of history.

Bedwetting



Thank you to the families who have been using the new drop off & pick up zone. Parents/guardians are able to safely drop and pick up our students close to either of two pedestrian gates.

This will free up more spaces for parents/guardians who wish to park then walk their children to/from classrooms, particularly if their children are in Prep - 2 classes.

We have almost 1000 students (700 families) entering and departing our school everyday, which is situated on very busy Point Cook Road.

Please try to use the new drop off and pick up zone, it is running very smoothly.

On average, our students are being safely collected in less than 10 minutes from the drop off zone after school.


