#### 2026 PARENT PAYMENTS

We are working through some changes to Parent Payments for 2026. Parents can expect to see significantly lower curriculum contributions (previously \$325 per year), while booklists will see an increase as we continue to strengthen our learning programs using carefully curated, high-quality resources. A number of book studies are currently in development, and we expect novels to be on some booklists, as well as mini whiteboards and a number of new textbooks for English and Mathematics. Further details will be provided as soon as possible.
















Our staff completed another professional development session with Rebecca Challoner, the CEO and Founder of My Spirited Child.
