We are working through some changes to Parent Payments for 2026. Parents can expect to see significantly lower curriculum contributions (previously \$325 per year), while booklists will see an increase as we continue to strengthen our learning programs using carefully curated, high-quality resources. A number of book studies are currently in development, and we expect novels to be on some booklists, as well as mini whiteboards and a number of new textbooks for English and Mathematics. Further details will be provided as soon as possible.

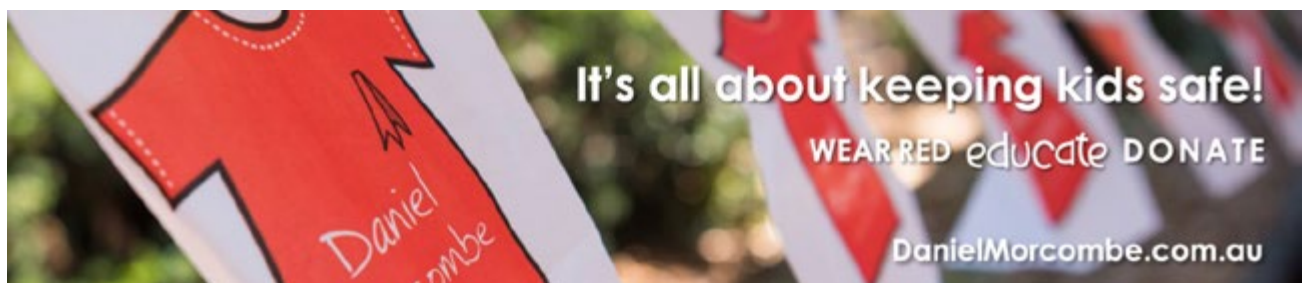

Divison Basketball Finals



Congratulations to our girls basketball team, who competed at the Hobson's Bay Divisional finals yesterday. We had 10 players in the team and they acquitted themselves extremely well. So much so that they won the day by going undefeated in their 3 matches.

In the first, we played St. Martin's and it was tight early as each team worked the other out. After 5-6 minutes we started to get some repeat baskets and slowly started to build a lead. After half time we continued to team well, quickly moving the ball and defending well when they attacked. Imogen and Ariana got many rebounds and Paige, Mila and Ava H were providing quick transitions up and down the court. Matilda and Tahlia were then finishing off the work in offense, scoring a lot of our points. In the end we kept stretching the lead out to 21 points for a 35 - 14 victory.

The 2nd match v Sacred Heart, was definitely our toughest match. We were in front most of the game, but by no more than 3 or 4 points. It ebbed and flowed and we had to defend really well. Myra and Mahveen made a few baskets and Ava W was defending like her life depended on it. We kept it pretty tight and we were up 2-3 at half time. The second half got tense and both teams made a few nervous errors before settling into the game again. Imogen

and Ariana were strong on the boards and we slowed the game down in the last 5 minutes, to run some time off the clock and work the ball around in our forward half until a good shot opportunity presented itself. We were able to keep a gap between us and Sacred Heart and ended up 5 point winners.

In the final match, we came up against Stella Maris (who had won a game and lost a game), so it was still going to be challenging. Initially that was the case as it was very even early in the game. We were up 12 - 5 at the half and continued to build on that in the second half, eventually winning 24 - 11.

Grade 6 School Leaders Term 3 Review

In Term 3, school leaders took part in various activities that helped us connect more deeply with our school's values.

School Captains enjoyed guiding new Prep families during Prep 2026 transition.

Mr. Burns worked with the Grade 6 House Captains to help host a Volleyball Tournament involving all four school houses — Jade, Cobalt, Purple, and Orange. The matches were held twice a week during senior lunchtime, with a range of Grade 6 boys and girls proudly representing their house colours.

At the end of the tournament, Purple placed fourth, Cobalt came third, Jade secured second place, and the winning team was... Orange! This marks Orange's second victory out of the three inter-house competitions held so far this year. All teams demonstrated excellent teamwork and sportsmanship, with several games

coming down to the final points in exciting finishes. It was wonderful to see so many students having fun and showing great enthusiasm throughout the tournament.

Every Friday after lunch, the SWPBS Captains meet in Mr. Burns' classroom (Room 48) to collect compost from classrooms. The captains pair up and plan their collection route. They visit all the Prep and Grade 1 classrooms to gather their small compost bins. The bins are taken to the garden and emptied into the large compost bin before returning the small bins to the classrooms.

This compost initiative helps keep the school clean, fresh, and welcoming for everyone. It also prevents the regular bins from overflowing and teaches students sustainable habits they can continue into later years.
