Our Parents & Friends are thinking about bonus hot food days as fun local fundraisers. Yum!

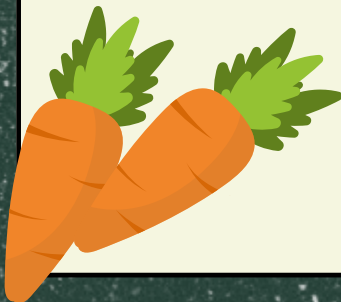

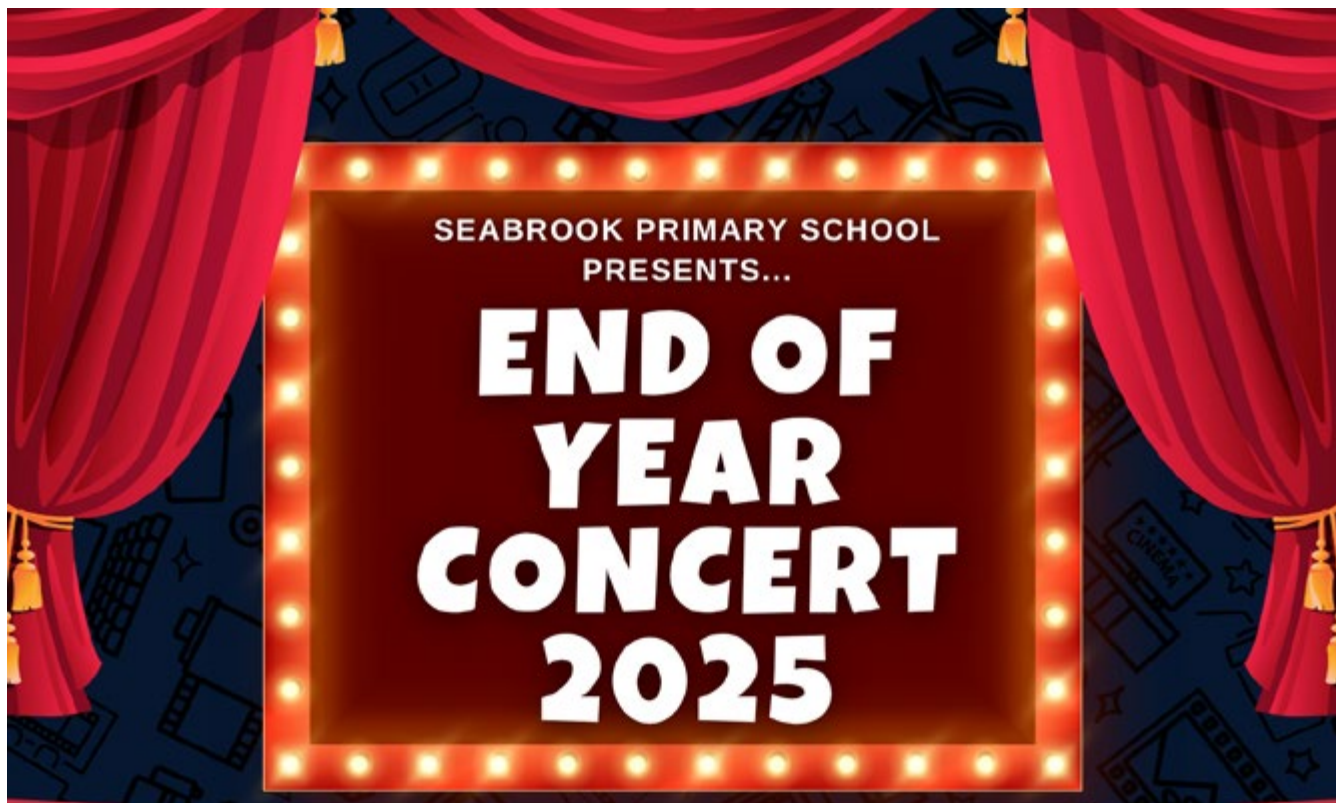

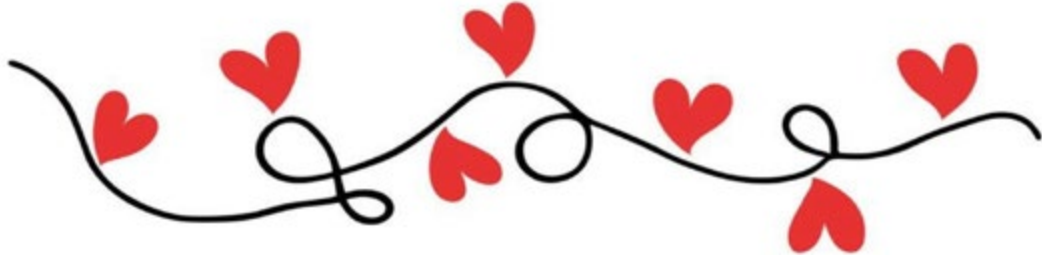

For families leaving Seabrook Primary School anytime between now and the end of the school year, please note the following important steps if your child has a school-configured BYOD 1to1 iPad or MacBook.

- Before leaving, all files and photos must be backed up to another location, and your child must be signed out of iCloud. Once everything required is safely saved off the device and iCloud is signed out (if applicable), the device needs to be returned to the school so it can be removed from our systems and portals.



- Please ensure this process is completed at least two school days before your child's final day to avoid delays.
- If you wish to on-sell your device to families currently on our waiting list for a used device, you may leave it at the front office for a valuation and condition check. Devices from 2020 or newer are the most in demand. Please include your name and contact number when leaving your device with our friendly front office staff.
- If you have any further questions, please visit the school's website (under ICT in the top right) or contact the school as soon as possible.



Starting at the beginning of next year, Seesaw will no longer be used at Seabrook Primary School or in the foreseeable future. **We strongly encourage all families to download and save a copy of their child's portfolio before the end of January 2026. This is an important step to ensure you keep a record of your child's learning.** After this date, all Seesaw content will be permanently removed and cannot be recovered, so please take action as soon as possible.

Works notification: Point Cook Road and Central Avenue Intersection Upgrade - major works starting January

We're upgrading the Point Cook Road and Central Avenue intersection to reduce travel times, improve safety and traffic flow and make it safer for people to walk around the area.

In January, we'll start major works around the intersection, including closing the Point Cook Road entry ramp to the Princes Freeway, Geelong-bound. There will also be some lane closures and night works.

What we're doing and when

From **10pm Monday 12 January 2026** until early March, we'll close the Point Cook Road Geelong-bound entry ramp to the Princes Freeway. Detours will be in place.

From 10pm Monday 12 January to 5am Saturday 24 January, Point Cook Road will be reduced to one lane heading north towards the roundabout.

During this time, we'll:

- install temporary concrete barriers around the works area
- start building a new slip lane from Point Cook Road to the entry ramp
- install new drainage, kerb, footpaths, and road pavement at the entry ramp.

Working hours

We'll work between **7am and 6pm, Monday to Saturday**. At times, we'll also need to work outside these hours including nights.

- from Point Cook Road detours via Sneydes Road and Dunnings Road to Boardwalk Boulevard
- from Altona Meadows access the Princes Freeway towards Geelong at Newland Street.

We'll maintain access to homes, businesses, and footpaths throughout these works.

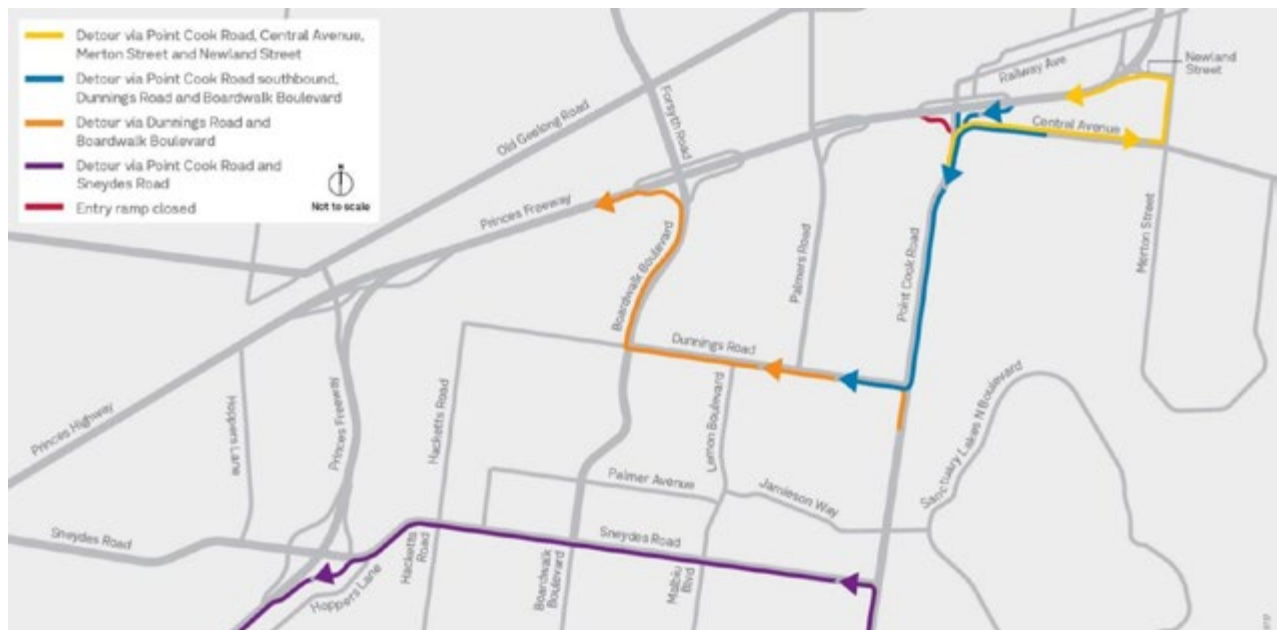
