Extra-Curricular Items and Activities – provided on a user-pays basis

Seabrook Primary School offers a range of optional items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides to deliver the Curriculum.

The cost of extra-curricular items and activities will be advised throughout the year, as plans are finalised for incursions and excursions.

For Grade 3-6 students, there is typically also an <u>Athletics Day</u> (approx. \$10pp), a <u>camp</u> (typically \$300-\$500pp), and other special opportunities such as competitive sports – individually priced according to travel expenses.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Contributions Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

and Activities Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Extra-Curricular Items
